
EYE CATCHER Assembly Instructions - Page 1.



WHAT YOU'LL NEED: Scissors, glue (or a glue stick), a ruler, a needle, a toothpick, a sharp pencil and about two feet of string. Transparent tape is optional.

FOLDING TIP: It's helpful to 'score' the fold lines before folding. You can use an old ink pen, a knitting needle, the end of a paper clip, or any metal object that will crease the paper without tearing it. Scoring will help you fold much more quickly and precisely.

ASSEMBLY:

Cut out the CUP on Parts Page 1. Fold the eight dark gray tabs DOWNWARD. Fold the eight filigree panels without gems DOWNWARD. Fold DOWNWARD between the eight filigree panels with gems and fold the tab with a yellow dot DOWNWARD.

Glue the tab with a yellow dot to the unprinted side of the opposite panel. Then glue the dark gray tabs to the unprinted side of the adjacent panels, forming a piece like the one shown in Figure 1.

Cut out the HANDLE on Parts Page 1. Fold the gray tab DOWNWARD and then fold DOWNWARD between all eight metal panels. Glue the gray tab to the unprinted side of the opposite panel, forming a cone as shown in Figure 2.

Put glue on the eight light gray CUP tabs and then place the HANDLE directly over those tabs, as shown in Figure 3. Glue the tabs to the inside of the HANDLE.

Now cut out the CUP LINER on Parts Page 2. The octagonal panel without filigree is the bottom panel. Fold the bottom panel UPWARD and fold the seven light gray tabs UPWARD. Fold the eight filigree panels without gems UPWARD and then fold UPWARD between the eight panels with gems.

Beginning with the light gray tab nearest to the bottom panel, glue the seven light gray tabs to the unprinted side of the bottom panel, forming a cup as shown in Figure 4.

Place the CUP LINER inside the CUP, as shown in Figure 5, and glue the upper panels together. Trim the upper edge if needed.

Next, cut out the EYE FRONT on Parts Page 2. Fold the eight dark gray tabs DOWNWARD. Then fold the eight metal panels with rivets DOWNWARD. Thinking of the piece as a wheel, gently curve each of the eight 'spokes' DOWNWARD (curving them over your finger tips works fine).

Glue the eight dark gray tabs to the unprinted side of the adjacent metal panels, forming a dome as shown in Figure 6.

Cut out the EYE BACK on Parts Page 2. Fold and assemble the EYE BACK in the same manner as we did the EYE FRONT.

The EYE FRONT is slightly larger than the EYE BACK, so the EYE FRONT should fit over the EYE BACK the way a lid fits over a box. Place glue on the gray EYE BACK panels, and then carefully place the riveted EYE FRONT panels directly over them and glue in place, as shown in Figure 7. Use plenty of glue and press gently until the glue takes hold.

Now all we need to do is connect the eyeball to the eye catcher. Cut out the CONNECTOR on Parts Page 2. Fold the blank gray panel DOWNWARD and glue it to the unprinted side of the riveted panels. Trim as needed. Fold DOWNWARD between the two riveted panels. Then tie one end of the string around the center of the CONNECTOR, as shown in Figure 8. (You may want to put some glue on the knot so it stays tied.)

Glue the riveted CONNECTOR panels directly over any two matching panels on the EYEBALL, as shown in Figure 9.

Use the needle to punch a hole in one of the eye catcher's upper panels, slightly above the gem, and then enlarge this hole with the toothpick, as shown in Figure 10. Further enlarge this hole with the pencil until it's large enough to run your string through. (If you want, you can now place transparent tape over the hole on both sides to strengthen the eye catcher. Then punch the hole again, using the needle, toothpick and pencil.)

Run the string through the hole in the eye catcher and tie securely, as shown in Figure 11. If you want, you can again add some glue to the knot so it stays tied.

And that's everything! Your new Eye Catcher is ready to play with. See how many times in a row you can catch the eyeball. Or challenge friends to see who can catch the most in a row. Make a second eye catcher and race your friends to see who can catch the most eyeballs fastest. Or just sit back and catch eyeballs while listening to your favorite music, it's a great way to relax.
